






Fitness - Adventure trail

In year 4, we had a dentist and a dental nurse come into our class to explain to us about teeth and why it is important to brush our teeth twice a day! We learnt that the only thing stronger than our teeth is diamond! Some children had the chance to try using a disclosing tablet which dyed their mouths purple - this enabled the rest of the children in the group to help them make sure they cleaned their teeth correctly. Everyone got a toothbrush to take home so we are all going to have shiny white teeth in year 4!

Orienteering: compass challenge!

In forest school, we have been learning about compasses: why we need them; how they work; and how to use them. We have such an exciting time texting our knowledge of the cardinal and intercardinal directions. Once we had mastered them, we put our compass skills to the test!

In art, we have been showcasing our learning from across the unit by working in groups to create giant prints inspired by our collages and wax-resist drawings. We needed to make sure we used our teamwork skills to ensure everyone's ideas were included.

Science- Vertebrates and Invertebrates

In Science, Year 6 have been learning about the Linnaean system, which was invented by Carl Linnaeaus in order to classify organisms. We initially considered the comparisons between both warm and cold blooded vertebrates before extending our knowledge to consider invertebrates and microorganisms. Guided Reading- War Horse

In guided reading, we have adored being introduced to our fiction text for this term: War Horse. We have been completely immersed in the story; bringing history to life as we have explored the events of World War 1 through the eyes of the characters. This powerful novel has already sparked so many rich discussions and has deepened our historical understanding.

Woodthorpe wrap-around care

We are delighted to be able to offer full wraparound support for our families. This starts from 7.50am and continues until 5:45pm daily. Our offer includes care for all of our children, from nursery to year 6. *Nursery pupils must book wraparound care sessions through the nursery as, due to the childcare funding, they receive, the charges are different.*

Breakfast Club: (7.50-8.50am) **£4.20/session £3.15/siblings**. Children have a wide range of breakfasts and also have the chance to play games with their friends or take part in a morning physical activity to really help wake them up.

After School Club (3.15-5.45pm) **£9.00/session £7.50/sibling**. At after school club, children start the session by having a snack and completing a 'circle' activity. From this, pupils then have the option to complete activities with their friends, take part in physical activities or relax with a book or film.

If you are interested in our wrap-around care options, please pop into the office and ask for our wraparound care administrator, Caroline Young.

Childminders

Support Via the Pupil Premium

Given the difficult times and changes to people's circumstances. If you feel that you might be eligible to claim 'Pupil Premium' for your child, we will be able to support you with items such as school uniform, breakfast club and daily school meals etc... Please email our school office **admin@woodthorpe.elt.org.uk** or call in person to discuss 01904 806464. You will need to currently be in receipt of one of the following:

- Universal Credit, (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods)
- Child Tax Credit, provided you are also not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual household gross income that does not exceed £16,190 (as assessed by HMRC)
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit

A run-on of Working Tax Credit - paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
